Discussion of Green Features for New Public Works Facility Continue

The public discussion of sustainable design features that may be incorporated into the proposed new Public Works Facility will continue at 7 p.m., Wed., June 29 in Village Hall, 123 Madison St.

A brief background review of the LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) standards process of the U.S. Green Building Council (GBC) will be presented along with follow up to public input gathered at the last meeting.

The goal of the meeting is to develop a consensus about what green features the community would like to be considered for the facility as the Village applies a \$100,000 grant from the Illinois Clean Energy Foundation toward achieving a silver level LEED rating for the new building.

Attendees also will have an opportunity to meet with Village staff involved in the project and representatives of the architectural firm and management company hired to oversee construction of a new facility on the current site along South Boulevard at Lombard Avenue.

The upcoming meeting is the fifth in a series intended to keep neighbors informed about the project and engage them in a collaborative process with the Village in developing a design that is sensitive to the neighborhood.
