Seventh Annual July 4th Parade to Step Off at 10 a.m.

The many dimensions of diversity in Oak Park will be on display when the seventh annual Independence Day Parade steps off at 10 a.m., Wed., July 4 from Longfellow Park at Ridgeland Avenue and Adams Street.

The parade will march north on Ridgeland and end in Taylor Park at Division Street. A children's concert sponsored by the Park District of Oak Park is planned for after the parade.
