Snow Removal Ordinance



The ordinance requires all property owners, occupants or lessees to remove snow and ice from public sidewalks fronting and abutting parcels on lots within 24 hours after the cessation of any snow, sleet or freezing rain. Failure to clear the sidewalk fronting or abutting you properly could result on a citation and or court appearance. Some of the Village's Parking Rules when it Snows.



- After two inches of snow-fall, all snow parking regulations are in effect seven (7) days a week, including holidays.
- When snowfalls exceeds two inches, parking is prohibited on major thoroughfares designated as snow routes and are restricted to one side on all other streets.
- Always look for posted snow route signs to determine if you have to move your car to a legal parking space on an alternate street.
- If you park on a street that is not a posted snow route, from 8a.m. to 10p.m. you must park on the even numbered address side of the street (East and North sides of street) on even numbered days and on the odd numbered address side of the street (west and south sides of street) on odd number days.
- The odd/even parking regulation does not pertain to snow routes. All snow routes must be completely cleared of parked cars, on both sides of the streets, after two inches of snow-fall.

Due to heavy citizen complaints in reference to dangerous conditions during the arrival and dismissal, please adhere to the following parking restrictions when dropping off/picking-up children in or around school zones.

- **No double parking**
- **Always pull curbside when dropping off**
- **Don't block driveway entrances**
- **No parking, standing or dropping off is allowed in the handicapped restriction zone unless your vehicle has handicapped plates or placard**
- **Drive cautiously and slowly because children may suddenly run from in between parked cars.**

Surfing Safely

Remind children of hidden dangers that lurk on the internet



As parents, we know what advice to give our children about physical dangers: look both ways before crossing the street; never get into a car with someone you don't know; say "no" to drugs. But with the popularity of the internet soaring and the age of it's users dropping, a whole new set of dangers that are much less tangible threaten our children. That's why it's important to talk to your children about safety in cyberspace.

Below are a few simple rules for children who are surfing the net:

- Go online with a friend, if possible.
- Never give out your personal information, such as your name, address, phone number, school, description or picture.
- Use chat rooms specific to your interest and age.
- Don't open e-mail from screen names you don't recognize.

- Don't "instant message" with screen names you don't know.
- Never meet in person someone you met online.
- Tell an adult if you are trouble by anything you see online.
- Use computers in supervised environments, such as home or the library.
- Remember, people you meet online aren't necessarily who they say they are.
- Parents should contact their internet provider for information on Parental Control and how to restrict access to certain sites.
