The Oak Park Police Department follows a community-based policing philosophy that relies on citizen involvement, problem solving, ethical behavior, leadership and the value of employees.

Police Officer Minimum Requirements:

- At least 21 years of age and have not passed their 35th birthday by the closing date for application, unless otherwise exempt under Section 6 of the Act, 65 ILCS 5/10-2. /1-6.
- U.S. Citizen who speaks and understands English or is legally authorized to work in the United States under federal law or is an individual against whom immigration action has been deferred by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services under the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) process is authorized to apply for the position of police officer, subject to (i) all requirements and limitations, other than citizenship, to which other applicants are subject and (ii) the individual being authorized under federal law to obtain, carry, or purchase or otherwise possess a firearm.
- Possess at least 60 hours of college credit at a fully accredited college or university and also possess a minimum grade average of "C" by application deadline.
- Military service may be used toward the college requirements. Every two (2) years of continuous honorable active-duty service shall be considered equivalent to thirty (30) semester credit hours. Therefore, four (4) years of continuous honorable active-duty service shall be considered equivalent to the full sixty (60) semester credit hours, satisfying the entire education requirement. Documentation of military service, including documentation of discharge status (e.g. DD-214 or equivalent) is required.
- Possess a valid driver's license.
- Must have corrected 20/20 vision.
- Possess a Firearm Owners Identification (FOID) card at time of hire.

*Class specifications are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in the class. Specifications are **not** intended to reflect all duties performed within the job.*

DEFINITION

To perform a variety a variety of duties in the prevention of crimes; to control traffic flow and enforce State and local traffic regulations; and to perform a variety of technical and administrative tasks in support of the Department.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

Receives general supervision from higher level supervisory and management staff.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES - *Essential and other important duties and responsibilities may include, but are not limited to, the following:*

Essential duties and responsibilities

1. Patrol a designated area of the Village to preserve law and order, discover and prevent the commission of crimes, and arrest offenders; check buildings for physical security.
2. Respond to general public service calls and complaints including domestic disturbances, civil complaints, property and violent crimes, automobile accidents, and related misdemeanor and felony incidents.
3. Collect, process, photograph and present evidence including fingerprints, fibers, blood and related physical evidence.
4. Enforce traffic laws and ordinances; check speed with radar; issue warnings and citations.
5. Direct traffic at fires, special events, and other emergency or congested situations.
6. Investigate traffic accidents; conduct investigations of serious injury and fatality traffic accidents.
7. Contact and cooperate with other law enforcement agencies in matters relating to the apprehension of offenders and the investigation of offenses.

8. Maintain contact with citizens regarding potential law enforcement problems and preserve good relationships with the general public; take an active role in areas of public education relative to crime and crime prevention.
9. Prepare reports on arrests made, activities performed and unusual incidents observed.
10. Investigate crimes; gather and preserve evidence; interview victims, complainants and witnesses; identify and interrogate suspects; apprehend and arrest offenders; testify and present evidence in court.
11. Promote the Department's community-based policing strategy through delivery of quality services to members of the community and through positive interactions between police officers and citizens; to open up channels for the exchange of information and ideas.
12. Seek and find ways to solve community problems and affirmatively promote, preserve and foster feelings of security and safety.

Other important responsibilities and duties:

1. Maintain custody of prisoners; transfer prisoners to jail.
2. May conduct a variety of criminal investigations involving crimes against persons and property, auto theft, white collar crime, and narcotics; conduct covert and undercover investigations as assigned; gather evidence and prepare cases for prosecution.
3. May serve as Training Coordinator' maintain training files; develop training programs; coordinate outside trainings programs with agencies and jurisdictions; review and evaluate current and future training programs.
4. May serve as Crime Prevention Officer; oversee and coordinate crime prevention activities; make presentations to local citizens and community groups.
5. May serve as Evidence Technician; process crime scenes for evidence, etc.
6. May serve as Youth Officer; process juvenile offenders, etc.
7. May serve as field training officer – Teach, guide, observe and evaluate recruit officers, etc.
8. Perform related duties and responsibilities as required.

QUALIFICATIONS - *Required at the time of hire or learned within a short period of time in order to perform the essential duties*

Knowledge of:

- Police methods and procedures including patrol, crime prevention, traffic control, investigation and identification techniques.

- Criminal law and criminal procedure with particular reference to the apprehension, arrest and custody of persons committing misdemeanors and felonies, including rules of evidence pertaining to the seizure and preservation of evidence.
- Offensive and defensive weapons nomenclature and theory.
- Use of firearms and other modern police equipment.
- First aid principles, practices and techniques.
- Self-defense tactics.
- Interviewing and interrogation techniques
- Departmental rules and regulations, policies, procedures and directives.

Ability to:

- Observe accurately and remember names, faces, numbers, incidents and places.
- Use and properly care for firearms.
- Understand, interpret and apply laws, regulations, policies and procedures.
- Prepare clear, accurate and grammatically correct written reports.
- Analyze situations quickly and objectively and take necessary emergency action.
- Identify potential crime situations or traffic hazards and take preventive actions
- Meet the first aid requirement as prescribed by the State of Illinois.
- Learn the operation of standard equipment and facilities required in the performance of assigned tasks.
- Meet the physical requirements established by the Department.
- Communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing.
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- Maintain physical condition to perform essential duties as specified by police officer certification.



POLICE OFFICER

Maintain physical condition appropriate to the performance of assigned duties and responsibilities which may include the following:

- *Effecting arrests.*
- *Subduing resisting individuals*
- *Chasing fleeing subjects*
- *Running, walking, crouching or crawling during emergency operations*
- *Moving equipment and injured/deceased persons*
- *Climbing stairs/ladders*
- *Performing life-saving and rescue procedures*
- *Walking, standing or sitting for extended period of time*
- *Operating assigned police equipment and vehicles.*

Effectively deal with personal danger which may include exposure to:

- *Armed/dangerous persons*
- *Dangerous animals*
- *Communicable disease*
- *Hazards of emergency driving*
- *Hazards associated with traffic control and working in and near traffic*
- *Natural and man-made disasters*

Maintain effective audio-visual discrimination and perception needed for:

- *Making observations*
- *Communicating with others*
- *Reading and writing*
- *Operating assigned equipment and vehicles*

Maintain mental capacity which allows the capability of:

- *Exercising sound judgement and rational thinking under dangerous circumstances*
- *Evaluating various options and alternatives and choose an appropriate and reasonable course of action.*
- *Demonstrating intellectual; capabilities during training and testing processes.*

Experience and Training Guidelines

Experience: One year of law enforcement experience is desirable.

Training: Possession of an Associate's degree or successful completion of sixty (60) semester hours at an accredited college of university.



POLICE OFFICER

License or Certificate: Possession of, or ability to obtain, an appropriate, valid driver's license.
Possession of a police officer certificate

WORKING CONDITIONS

Work in an emergency peace control environment; work in intense life-threatening conditions; exposure to dangerous persons, firearms, bodily fluids, and noise; running, walking, crawling, climbing, stopping and lifting; work in inclement weather conditions.
