**COVID-19 Status Report
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

New Public Health Guidance

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Saturday, June 20	Oak Park Resident	1 Case
Sunday, June 21	Oak Park Resident	1 Case
Monday, June 22	Oak Park Resident	2 Cases

The above newly reported Oak Park cases were in their 20s-40s. Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of three-hundred and twenty-one (321) total Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listed within the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Public Health Director Charley reports cases remain unchanged since Friday.

Phase 4 Preparations

Also today, [the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity \(DCEO\) released their Phase 4 guidelines \(available via this link\)](#) for reopening under Governor JB Pritzker's "Restore Illinois" plan. The entire state is expected to move into Phase 4 (Revitalization) on Friday, June 26.

Public Health Director Mike Charley is in the process of emailing Oak Park licensed business this information today as well.

In general, moving to Phase 4 will allow more activity at Oak Park businesses with the following:

- **Bars and Restaurants:** May open for indoor seating with state-specific capacity limits & IDPH approved safety guidance.
- **Theaters:** May open following IDPH approved safety guidance.
- **Childcare:** DCFS licensed childcare facilities can remain open while following DCFS and Illinois State safety guidance.
- **Health Clubs:** Health clubs, gyms, and fitness studios will be allowed to reopen following IDPH approved safety guidance.
- **Retail:** And all retail stores can remain open to in-person shopping with state-specific capacity limits & IDPH approved safety guidance.
- **Personal Care Services** Personal care services, like nail salons, tattoo shops, hair braiders, spas and barbershops, can remain open with IDPH approved safety guidance.
- **Manufacturing:** All manufacturing can remain open with IDPH approved safety guidance.
- **"Non-essential" businesses:** Same as phase 3. Employees of "non-essential" businesses are allowed to return to work with IDPH approved safety guidance. Employers are encouraged to provide accommodations for COVID-19-vulnerable employees.
- **Gatherings:** Gatherings of 50 or fewer will be allowed, but are subject to change based on latest data and Illinois-state guidance.
- **Outdoor Recreation:** All outdoor recreation will be allowed.
