**COVID-19 Status Report
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

New Public Health Guidance

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of two thousand three hundred and seventy-eight (2378) Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listing the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

COVID-19 Vaccines

For current vaccination information visit the Village website at www.oak-park.us/covidvaccination. Through January 12, 2021, the Public Health Department has received a total of 3,535 first doses of vaccine (manufactured by either Pfizer or 300 Moderna shipped in 453 vials). In addition to the “first” doses described above, the Public Health Department has received 1,260 second doses

(shipped in 252 vials) which are administered at 21 or 28 days after the first dose based upon manufacturer.

The Public Health Department (as a state certified Local Health Department or LDH) is operating drive-thru clinics (aka Points of Distribution or PODs). The first test clinic was January 4, 2021 and on Friday, January 8, 2021, the Village was given access to utilize EMTrack, the State Online Scheduling Platform for the first time. It is noteworthy that I have referred to this early on as a registration systems – it is more correctly a scheduling system for clinics – it does not accommodate pre-registration when a clinic is not scheduled. Further, clinics are not scheduled until vaccine availability is assured. To date, vaccine supply remains unpredictable.

A second test clinic schedule was held this week on Monday, January 11, 2021 and utilized the EM Track scheduler. Based upon what we learned on January 4, staff has implemented important system improvements and doubled throughput. A second clinic is being held this week. Next week's schedule is dependent upon vaccine allocation. All clinic/PODs - are considered closed to date as we continue to vaccinate only 1a eligible health care workers. In other words, the Public Health Department does not have supply of vaccine sufficient to offer open access to the public for registration under 1a. All vaccination appointments done to date were based upon a prioritization of those essential to keeping health care system operational in Oak Park and administered to those health care workers which are not affiliated with Rush Oak Park Hospital, West Suburban Medical Center and PCC Wellness, a Federally Qualified Health Care Center. Public Health knowledge of Oak Park institutions with 1a eligible healthcare workers and history of outbreaks (and not being service by the State/Federal program to vaccinate at Long Term Care facilities) also informed prioritization. Groups vaccinated include workers at independent Oak Park Pharmacies, medical physicians, residential congregate care worker that directly support persons w/developmental disabilities and/or the elderly and our local funeral home. Dental professionals as well as mental health professionals that are not affiliated with a hospital system are a key priority and public private partnerships are being developed to accelerate these health care workers as supply is available.

Oak Park is fortunate to be service by two hospitals and a Federally Qualified Health Care Center. The 2014-2018 American Community Survey five-year estimates for Oak Park show the following numbers:

At this point, Public Health does not yet know a definitive date when Phase 1b will begin. Planning for that group is occurring and information will be provided as soon as it is available. Public-private partnership will also be a key in this phase.

As they have throughout the pandemic, our employees working in the Public Health Department continue to work tirelessly to respond to the changing dynamics. We continue to make staffing changes to support the Public Health Department. A six-month temporary position of Assistant to the Emergency Preparedness Coordinator was hired this week and we have increased the hours of Angela Schell, Social Media Coordinator, from part time to full time to focus on vaccinate related communications.

Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Interim Public Health Director Terry reported (1) case reported Monday as a resident of Oak Park Oasis reported Monday has been determined to be not linked to Oak Park Oasis. The bulletin has been adjusted.

Public Health Data

Interim Public Health Director Terry has shared the following data related to COVID-19.

“New cases per 100,000 People”. This metric looks at the number of recent COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people to describe the potential number of people who are currently ill and may be infectious. This is the number of new cases reported by IDPH in the previous week. Calculated as a rate = [Village of Oak Park case count for 7 days] / [Village population] x100,000.

- Oak Park rate: 290/100,000
- Cook County rate: 302/100,000 (12/27/2020 through 1/2/2021)
- Target for County-level data: Cases for the week are fewer than 10 or the rate is fewer than 50 cases per 100,000 people
- Warning for County-level data: New case rate is greater than 50 cases per 100,000 people




