**COVID-19 Status Report
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

New Public Health Guidance

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of two thousand four hundred and eighty (2480) Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listing the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

At the regular Village Board meeting on Tuesday, January 19, 2021, the Village Board extended the Declaration of an Emergency Affecting Public Health to June 15, 2021. The Village Board additionally approved Ordinance 21-8 to provide ongoing COVID-19 public health response authority to the Public Health Director through June 15, 2021.

COVID-19 Vaccines

It is noted that at this time Oak Park remains in Phase 1a – Health Care Eligible Workers.

- Since the first vaccines were delivered in Oak Park on December 17, 2020 through January 12, 2021, the Public Health Department has received a total of 3,535 first doses of vaccine. – which averages less than 600 doses per week.
- All doses of vaccine received have been allocated to Oak Park hospitals to vaccinate their workers AND the Public Health Department has administered vaccine to non-affiliated workers.
- Looking forward to Phase 1b (65 and older & essential workers) the estimated maximum demand in Oak Park for 1b could be more than 12,000. As such, vaccine supply remains insufficient to meet the demand.
- Public Health will announce when we have vaccine supply to start 1b and the top priority in 1b will be seniors in congregate living facilities not being vaccinated by Federal/State partnerships and those seniors in income eligible apartments.

Public Health Data

Interim Public Health Director Terry has shared the following data related to COVID-19.

“New cases per 100,000 People”. This metric looks at the number of recent COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people to describe the potential number of people who are currently ill and may be infectious. This is the number of new cases reported by IDPH in the previous week. Calculated as a rate = [Village of Oak Park case count for 7 days] / [Village population] x100,000.

- Oak Park rate: 196/100,000
- Cook County rate: 362/100,000 (1/3/2021 through 1/9/2021)
- Target for County-level data: Cases for the week are fewer than 10 or the rate is fewer than 50 cases per 100,000 people
- Warning for County-level data: New case rate is greater than 50 cases per 100,000 people

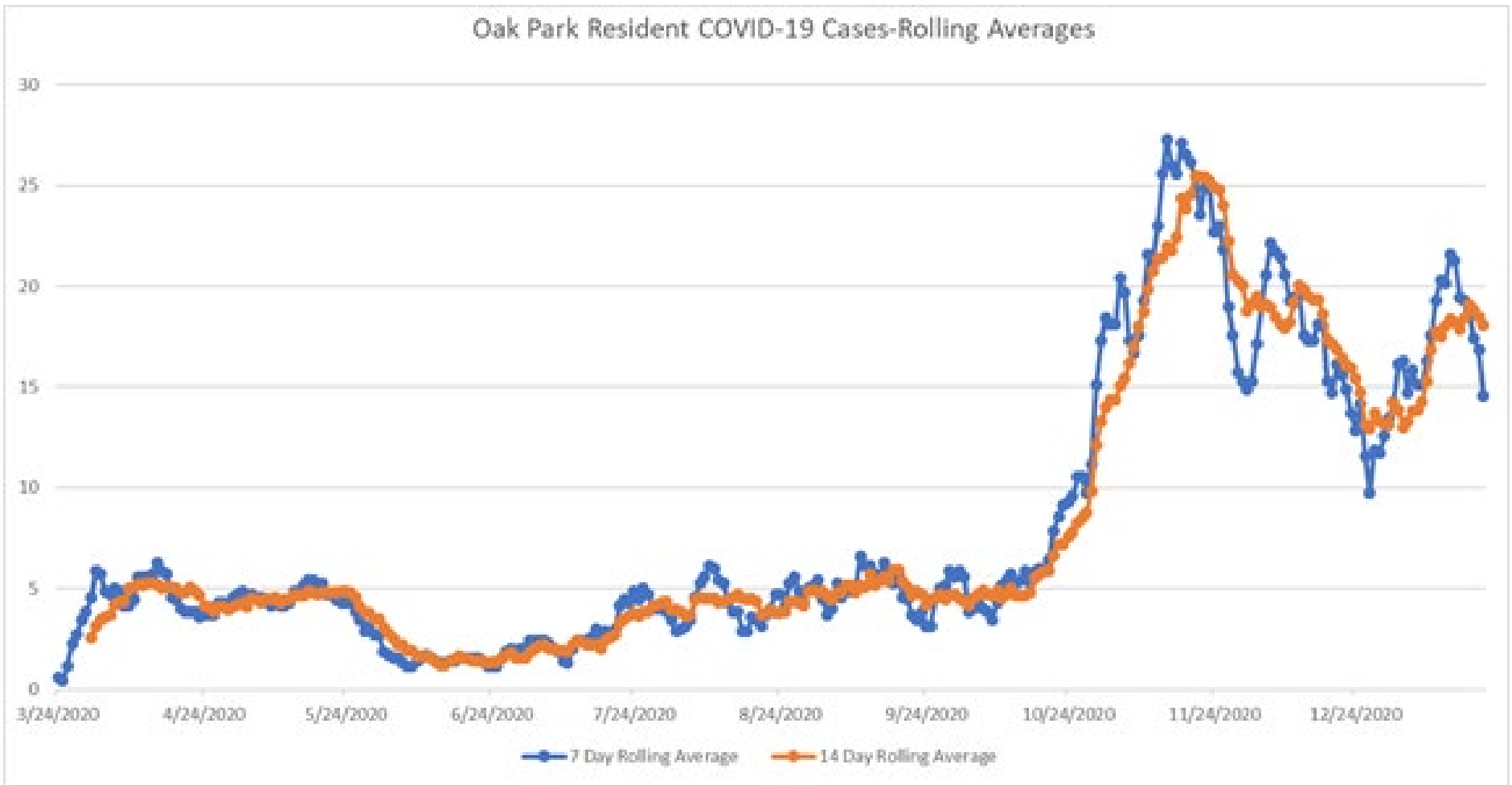

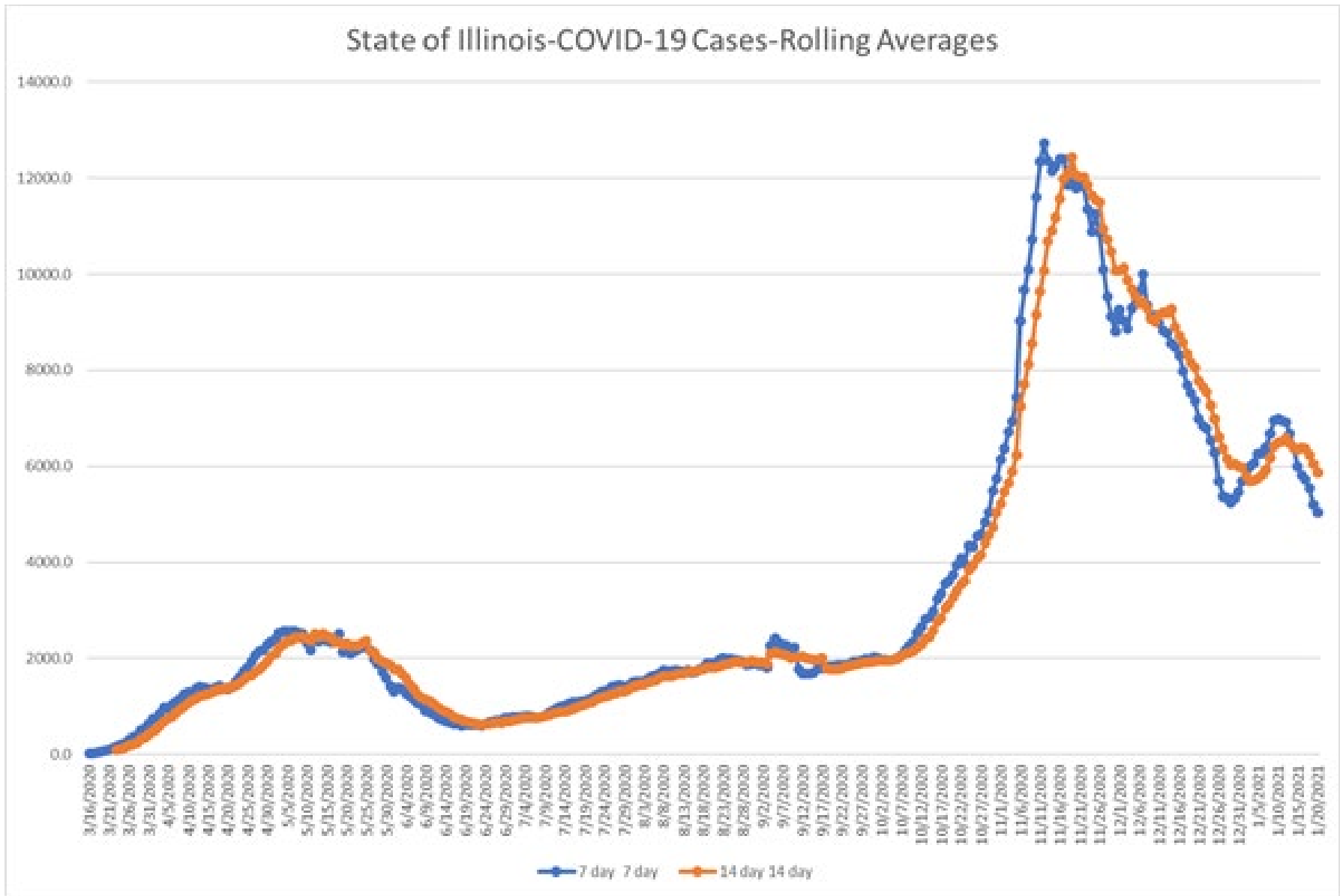
