COVID-19 Status Report Oak Park Village Board of Trustees

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

### **New Public Health Guidance**

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of two thousand six hundred and fifty-one (2651) Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listing the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Today, with the continued reduction in new cases on a rolling average, Interim Public Health Director Terry issued new public health guidance which allows for increased indoor dining capacity in restaurants to the lesser of 50 patrons or 50% of capacity per room. The maximum size of any group dining together is six (6) persons.

#### Vaccinations

Through February 9, 2021, the Public Health Department has allocated 6,612 vaccine doses to local private partners such as Rush Oak Park, West Suburban Hospital and PCC Wellness for first doses and second doses of vaccine, primarily for Phase 1a health care workers. Some of these health care providers are also receiving vaccine from the Public Health Department for Phase 1b vaccines, subject to IDPH approval. The Village's Public Health Department has administered 1,329 vaccinations doses to both Phase 1a and 1b eligible individuals, the majority of which are first doses. Additionally, another 500 vaccine doses (first doses) are estimated to have been administered in long term care facilities through the State/Federal partnership with CVS and Walgreens.

## Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Interim Public Health Director Terry reports a new COVID-19 positive staff member at Oak Park Arms, 408 S. Oak Park Avenue.

## **Public Health Data**

Interim Public Health Director Terry has shared the following data related to COVID-19. "New cases per 100,000 People". This metric looks at the number of recent COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people to describe the potential number of people who are currently ill and may be infectious. This is the number of new cases reported by IDPH in the previous week. Calculated as a rate = [Village of Oak Park case count for 7 days] / [Village population] x100,000.

- Oak Park rate: 80/100,000
- Cook County rate: 181/100,000 1/17/2021 through 1/23/2021)
- Target for County-level data: Cases for the week are fewer than 10 or the rate is fewer than 50 cases per 100,000 people
- Warning for County-level data: New case rate is greater than 50 cases per 100,000 people




