The meeting was called to order at 7:31 p.m.

Acting Chief of Police Reynolds stated that there has not been but we are prepared and we have increased foot patrols.

Director Scott-Valdez informed the committee that there are five spots reserved for the next academy which starts in September. The civilian staff is getting established as well. Committee Member Downing asked about the rewrite which Director Scott-Valdez will bring back to the next meeting. Director Scott-Valdez also notified the committee that they will need to complete the on-line Open Meetings Act training. We will supply the link for the training.

There was a discussion on who should be the next Citizen Police Oversight Committee Chair. Committee Member Ford was nominated by Committee Member Luttig and seconded by Committee Member Downing.

There was a motion by Committee Member Nowicki seconded by Committee Member Luttig to go into Executive Session. Ayes: All, Nays: None. The meeting adjourned to Executive Session at 7:57 p.m.
